Project achieved activities at a glance from July,13 to Nov, 13

- 1812 ASHA visited on daily basis.
- 416 AWW visited on daily basis.
- 47 VHND meetings attended and share the issue of diarrhea management.
- 55 ASHAs meetings(sector level) with 2142 participants.
- 18 meetings with MOIC/ANM at CHC/PHC level with the participation of 415
- 17 AWW sector meetings with 695 participants.
- 6 batches training of ASHA and trained 187
 ASHAs

Challenges/reasons for variance in ASHAs training

- The project team got orientation and direction of job responsibilities in the mid October.
- Blocks activities were not in proper functioning due to various festivals and holidays(13 days during Oct and Nov).
- Ignorant and irregular reporting of diarhhea cases through ASHAs
- Due to not getting proper cooperation of block officials regarding the issues.
- Difficulties faced during the liasaning with district level medical officials regarding the issue.

Solutions applied



- Received solid guidance through CHAI team regarding the major achievements of the project.
- Strong advocacy with CMO was being done getting his permission letter for the blocks.
- MOICs, HEOs and BPM was sensitized for organizing their sector level meetings.
- As a result of daily visits of the blocks/ASHAs and meetings with blocks officials it has been fruitful for their participation and cooperation in the diarrhea management.
- BPM are taking interest to find out the report of diarhhea through ASHAs during sector level meetings.

- 1945 ASHA visited on daily basis.
- 499 AWW visited on daily basis.
- 52 VHND meetings attended.
- 67 ASHAs meetings with 2666 participants.
- 22 meetings with MOIC/ANM at CHC/PHC level with the participation of 472.
- 17 AWW sector meetings with 695 participants.
- 24 batches training of ASHA and trained 924 ASHAs.
